Preliminary Findings on the VT Shootings: Shortly after the Virginia Tech attacks, John Giduck and two senior law enforcement officers with 50 years combined experience traveled to Blacksburg to obtain as much information as possible on the tactical situation confronted there, and on the operation ultimately launched.

Our Worst Has Got To Be Better Than Their Best: The attack on Beslan School #1 in September, 2004 portends much about ongoing threats to our society and highlights a great need to learn more. John Giduck went to Beslan, with professional connections good enough to be able to write an in depth analysis, *Terror at Beslan; a Russian Tragedy with Lessons for America’s Schools*.

Featured Articles

Each of the other four articles focuses on elements that are on point consistent with Giduck and the words of other featured books authors, Brian Michael Jenkins and Irwin Redlener. (*Unconquerable Nation; Knowing Our Enemy, Strengthening Ourselves and Americans at Risk; Why We Are Not Prepared for Megadisasters and What We Can Do Now*) These articles provide deeper context for understanding the threats to society and approach to solutions, and are directly applicable to formulating enlightened response to events such as those at Beslan and Virginia Tech. The offerings stretch from 1) a recommendation for what we should read to better understand the needs of homeland security and defense; to 2) the need for improvised responses that exhibit “swarm intelligence” – the ability of a community, even an ad hoc one, to demonstrate a higher level of collective behavior than could be predicted from the capabilities of individual members; to 3) use of knowledge management tools to aid decision makers in a complex OODA cycle: to finally, 4) evidence, examples and tools (including a Power Point Army Program overview) on teaching *adaptability* for those who must make time critical decisions in the worst of situations.
